## MEMORANDUM FOR SEE DISTRIBUTION

SUBJECT: United States Army Combined Arms Support Command and Fort Lee Policy Regarding the Rolling of Sleeves on the Army Combat Uniform (ACU)

- 1. Purpose. This policy provides clarification regarding the Army's guidance for rolling of the sleeves on the universal camouflage pattern (UCP) ACU, operational camouflage pattern (OCP) ACU or operation enduring freedom camouflage pattern (OEP-CP) ACU.
- 2. References.
- a. Department of the Army Pamphlet (DA PAM) 670-1, Guide to Wear and Appearance of the Army Uniforms and Insignia, 1 July 2015.
- b. Department of the Army (DA) G1 Authorization Memorandum, Authorization to Roll Sleeves on the Army Combat Uniform (ACU), 28 June 2016.
- 3. Applicability. This policy applies to all Active Duty Army, National Guard, and Army Reserve personnel while assigned to CASCOM units or present on Fort Lee.
- 4. Effective immediately Company, Troop, and Battery Commanders may authorize Soldiers within their formations to roll up the sleeves of the combat duty uniform. When the sleeves of the combat uniform are rolled, the camouflage pattern will remain exposed, the cuff will be rolled neatly above the elbow, and will be no more than three (3) inches above the elbow. Unit patch must be fully visible. Commanders may prescribe a specific uniform for formations or ceremonial occasions, such as parades when uniformity in appearance is required.
- 5. Sleeves should remain down when in field environments or when the extra protection is beneficial to the health and welfare of personnel (e.g., vehicle maintenance or area beautification details).
- 6. The seasonal wear dates for rolling of the sleeves will be at the Commander's discretion.
- 7. A copy of this policy will be posted on the CASCOM Command Policies website. This policy is effective until rescinded upon publication of any revision of DA PAM 670-1.
