SUBJECT: Foreign Disclosure Program

1. References:

- a. Army Regulation 380-10, Foreign Disclosure and Contacts with Foreign Representatives, dated 14 July 2015.
- b. DODD 5230.11, Disclosure of Classified Military Information to Foreign Governments and International Organizations, dated 16 June 1992.
- c. DODD 5230.20 Visits and Assignments of Foreign Nationals, dated 22 June 2005.
- d. NDP-1, National Disclosure Policy Fact Sheet.

2. Purpose: To establish a standard policy for CASCOM organizations regarding the procedures for initiation of Foreign Disclosure Program actions.

3. General: Foreign Disclosure (FD) is the conveying of Classified Military Information (CMI) and Controlled Unclassified Information (CUI) to a duly authorized foreign representative in any manner. A Disclosure Program is a program under which information and materiel are evaluated for the disclosure or potential disclosure of classified military information. Such programs must be evaluated in their entirety, from beginning to end and include all potential disclosures of classified military information in all NDP-1 disclosure categories. This includes conveying information, in any form or manner, to an authorized representative of a foreign government, foreign entity supporting U.S. interests and/or security objectives or international organization. Disclosures may be accomplished through oral, visual, or documentary modes.

4. Policy: All material involved with Foreign National visits, training, or briefings will be processed for review and approval for disclosure IAW reference 1a above and the enclosed CASCOM SOP for Foreign Disclosure. Additionally:

- a. All documents that contain Classified Military Information (CMI) or Controlled Unclassified Information (CUI), will be reviewed by the CASCOM FD office, in accordance with NDP-1, prior to the disclosure of material. Course Developers are responsible for keeping all written course material current and up to date. Before any new course material can be approved, a Foreign Disclosure Review of the material

must be completed. Likewise, any and all material to be briefed to foreign visitors will be provided to the CASCOM Foreign Disclosure Office for review and approval prior to the scheduled visit.

b. The DA International Visits Program has been established to ensure that CMI and CUI to be disclosed to foreign visitors has been properly vetted and authorized for disclosure to their governments, and that the requesting foreign government provides the appropriate security assurances for such visitors. The DA International Visits program is managed through the Foreign Visit System (FVS).


c. Requests for foreign student attendance at courses taught at Fort Lee will be sent from the TRADOC FD Office.

d. Requests for information (RFIs) will be sent through the proper channels as outlined in the CASCOM SOP for Foreign Disclosure.

e. Foreign Visit Requests (FVRs) will be processed as they are received from the TRADOC FD office.
