

SPECIAL VICTIM COUNSEL SERVICE

Your Rights As A Victim.

In addition to your right to assistance from a Special Victim Counsel, you have the following rights in any courts-martial:

- The right to be treated with fairness and with respect for your dignity and privacy;
- The right to be reasonably protected from the accused offender;
- The right to be notified of court proceedings;
- The right to be present at all public court proceedings related to the offense, unless the court determines that your testimony would be materially affected if you as the victim heard other testimony at trial;
- The right to confer with the attorney for the government in the case;
- The right to available restitution;
- The right to information about the conviction, sentencing, imprisonment, and release of the offender.

In closing, it is important for you to know that even if you have filed a restricted report, you are still entitled to SVC services and the opportunity to learn about the legal process and your rights as a victim.
